
ELDERS' MEETING

Within a matter of minutes, it was determined that, yes, we could hold a "Holiday Items" only rummage sale. It was announced to the congregation to bring in any unwanted holiday items which could be brought to the church and sold.

But, for what???

It was decided that the youth could be involved to help with this event. Calls, emails, texts, went out to the parents of our church youth. The proceeds for this event would be designated for Jesus Camp and other church camps that our youth would like to attend.

And, then it happened ...

Initially, nine tables were set up and boxes and totes were loaded on the tables. Busy hands were unpacking the Christmas, Thanksgiving, Easter, St. Pat's, Halloween, and other holiday items. Another three tables were added; more boxes were added. At the finale, 22 tables, eight-foot long, were needed to hold all the merchandise! After two days, a total of nine hours, and five pairs of hands, the sale was ready to begin.

Shoppers came in and were told that it was an **all-donation sale**, and the money was earmarked for youth church camps. Generosity came to a wonderful conclusion at the end of the sale -- \$1100.

CHURCH IN SOCIETY REPORT

CIS met on Monday, November 13th with 7 attending.

- The Tech School has brought it to our attention that they are in need of more snack items. The CIS Committee voted to spend \$150 on snack items for the Tech School.
- The Blessing Box Ministry at Clinton Community of Christ Church on Pawnee is one of our ongoing outreach projects. We have been supplying the Blessing Boxes with detergent, Women's hygiene items and incontinence items. The committee voted to spend \$200 per month on The Blessing Box
- Antioch Hills Housing has asked for donations of hygiene products, cleaning products, paper towels and toilet paper. A large donation of these items has been delivered to them. Plus we added socks and underwear. The majority of these products came from the Manna Harvest Warehouse.
- To complete Dani Dills' outreach project for the homeless for 10 tents and 10 sleeping bags we used the \$400 collected for this project to purchase 3 more tents and 11 more sleeping bags...giving us a total of 11tents and twelve sleeping bags. These items are ready to hit the streets.
- The committee voted to spend \$200 to restock the food pantry in the Holy Grounds Room. These items are given to clients that need a couple of days worth of meals. Pastor Tim will purchase can openers for those items that do not have pop-tops.
- We continue to give out eight(8) \$20 Gas Vouchers (auto gas) per month. The vouchers are given to clients and redeemed at Bullseve gas station. Bullseve bills the CIS committee each month to pay for these vouchers.
- We exceeded our goal of 900 cans of pork and beans for the Samaritan Center's Christmas Cheer program. Thank you to all that gave generously.
- Our Monday evening meal, Community Café, that we serve to those that need a meal continues to flourish. We are serving 65-80 meals each week. It will only get bigger. Thanks to all that help with this outreach project.
- CIS continues to help support H.O.P.E. Project, Zoe's House and Survival House with products they request.
- CIS allows Pastor Tim to have a discretionary cash fund to help those that come in and need items not offered by any of our other programs.

REMEMBER - 10% OF ALL MONIES GOING TO THE GENERAL FUND ARE USED FOR THESE OUTREACH PROJCTS. IT IS BECAUSE OF YOU THAT WE ARE ABLE TO HELP SO MANY IN SO MANY WAYS.
